



BFF Cozy Blanket, with i-cord edge

Recipe by: BFF's Lisa Mott and Capi Puszcz

To start blanket:

Cast on 5 stitches.

Row 1: k2, pm, kfb, pm, Wyif sl2pw

Row 2: *k2, sm, kfb, knit to marker, sm, wyif sl2pw*

Repeat Row 2 (* to *) until I-cord edge is desired width of blanket.

Turning the corner:

K2, sm, kfb, knit to marker, sm, with yarn in front, sl2pw

(Follow the wording of this next process exactly as written. All the (crazy?) movements of stitches on and off, back and forth, on needles, create the extra i-cord length required to make/fake a smooth turn, around the corner of the blanket.)

K2, sl those 2 stitches back on to left needle, k2 again, slip those 2 stitches back onto left needle, k2, sm, k2tog, knit to marker, sm, wyif sl2pw



This is the smooth edge you are creating

To continue on...establish the length of blanket:

NOTE: If you don't already have a row minder on your blanket, this is the time to place one: so you know the right side (Row 1) from your wrong side. (Row 2)

Row 1: k2, pm, kfb, pm, Wyif sl2pw

Row 2: k2, sm, k2tog, knit to marker, sm, wyif sl2pw

Repeat Row 1 & 2 until (longer) I-cord edge is desired length.

Finishing the last side of the blanket, requires no crazy motions - moving stitches etc...we want the i-cord to tighten up around this corner.

Row 1: *k2 sm, k2tog, knit to marker, sm, wyif sl2pw* repeat until your blanket is finished.

Note from Capi...

The i-cord finish (closing up the end of the blanket) is going to be fiddly. Just do your best. I repeated Row 1, until I was down to 4 stitches, and markers removed.

Turn work as usual. K2, k2tog (3 stitches remain) turn work k2tog, and slip that stitch over the remaining stitch
