

Supplies List

Supplies Week One

- 10" x 10" (approx. 25 cm squared) lightweight (3-5mm) silk
- 0.25 ounce (7 grams) 18-22 micron merino wool roving or top (finer than 18 micron is good)
- Small pieces of other types of lightweight fabric (looseweave, natural fabric) for sampling
- Small amounts 0.25-0.5 ounces (7-14 grams) of 18-22 micron wool roving or top for sampling
- Use available felting supplies for different samples such as unspun yarn, wool locks, higher micron wool, variety of colors of fine merino etc.

Supplies Week Two

- Two 14" x 72" (35.6 cm x 183 cm) lightweight (3-5mm) silk scarf blanks
- Other sizes of scarf blanks or lengths of cut silk may be used
- 1 ounce (28.3 grams) 18-22 micron merino wool roving or top (finer than 18 micron will work)
- Merino pre felt cutouts to cover scarf size chosen - 1.5 ounces or 44 grams prefelt for a 14" x 72" (35.6 cm x 183 cm) size

Supplies Week Three

- A variety of small pieces of lightweight (3-5mm) silk in chosen landscape colors
- Other small pieces of lightweight fabric such as cheesecloth or loose weave cotton
- 0.5 - 1 ounce (14 - 28 grams) 18-22 micron merino wool roving or top (finer than 18 micron will work) in chosen colors
- Inspirational landscape photos

Supplies Week Four

- A variety of handmade paper such as mulberry paper (koko or unryu), gampi (or kitakata), abaca and lokta
- Tea bags (tea removed and paper flattened out) or tea bag paper
- Small amounts 0.25-0.5 ounces (7-14 grams) of 18-22 micron wool roving or top for sampling with paper
- Heavier grade cotton cheesecloth or loose weave muslin 10"x10" for lamination sample
- 1 oz. (28 g) 18-22 micron merino
- A variety of lightweight silk for manipulation samples
- Small amounts 0.25-0.5 ounces (7-14 grams) of 18-22 micron wool roving or top for sampling with manipulation
- A variety of different types of inclusions and a small piece of 3 mm white silk gauze; inclusions could include cotton batting, batik cotton fabric, wool felt off cut, pre felt, other heavier fabrics such as upholstery/curtain fabric, or man made fabric such as lutradur

Tools List

- Two pieces of sheer nylon curtain cut to at least twice the size of the silk used
- Towels
- Square of fine rib corrugated rubber floor mat or stair tread – bigger than 10” x 10” (25 cm square) for sampling and sized to fit table for scarf making
- Two pool noodles (one can be cut in half if full length not needed)
- PVC pipe (½” to 1” diameter or 1.27-2.54 cm) - length should be bigger than sample size by about 4” or 10 cm at least.
- Water Applicator – ball brauser, spray bottle
- Soap – olive oil or other plain bar soap
- Fabric scissors or rotary cutter
- Disposable razor (optional)
- Plastic brush to rough up prefelt wool surface (optional)
- Disposable gloves (optional)
- Thin plastic (type for covering food) large enough to cover landscape in week three
- Blue painters tape
- Paper “croppers”, L shaped paper strips to block off edges of design
- Smart phone for taking photos
